### Lucile Wolfe

Memorial Mass will be celebrated Thursday, Sept. 25, at 2 p.m. at St. Rose Catholic Church for Lucile Wolfe, 85, a longtime Dell area rancher. Rosary will be recited at 7 p.m. Wednesday at the Brundage Funeral Chapel. Burial will follow at Mountain View Cemetery in Dillon.

Mrs. Wolfe died suddenly at Barrett Memorial Hospital Sunday, Sept. 21, 1997, one day after her 85th birthday.

She was born Sept. 20, 1912, in Thornton, Idaho, the second daughter of Neil and Nettie Anderson. She attended Thornton and Rigby area schools until her final two years of high school, when she went to Logan Academy in Utah.

She finished high school at Logan Academy as valedictorian of her graduating class. She attended college in Texas and Rexburg, Idaho, earning a teaching certificate. Her first teaching assignment was in Salmon, Idaho, where she met her future husband, Maurice Wolfe. They were married in Pocatello, Idaho, May 31, 1937, and lived at Lemhi where they ranched on the Old Indian Agency Ranch. She taught at the Lemhi School.

Lucile and Maurice purchased the Smith McKnight ranch near Dell in 1943, where they maintained their homes until their deaths. Perpetuation of the family's ranching heritage continued because of the focuses of her life. She loved her garden, especially her flowers, and made a life study of learning how to get things to flourish in a high altitude and a short growing season. She had a vast knowledge of edible plants and in nature, and at one point was referred to as another Ewell Gibbens. One of her greatest pleasures was taking her cut flowers and vegetables to her many friends and neighbors.

She developed a hobby in growing flowers for drying and working them into flower arrangements which resembled natural scenes.

She served as a member of the Dell School Board before its consolidation. Community affairs were uppermost in her concerns and she worked as a 4-H leader, helped in the creation of the Dell Community Hall and was an active participant in the Dell Home Demonstration Club. She was also a member of St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Maurice, and two sisters, Emma Anderson of Thornton, Idaho, and Clara Ellis of Leadore. She is survived by two sisters, Mary Thomas of Menan, Idaho, and Edith Anderson of San Francisco, Calif., and two brothers, Rush Anderson of Thornton, Idaho, and Keith Anderson of Sacramento, California; two sons, Ed Wolfe of Dell and Dr. Harve Wolfe of Dillon;

two daughters, Margaret Ann Gough of Oxnard, Calif., and Angela Wolfe of Phoenix, Ariz; two granddaughters and one grandson.

The family requests memorials to the Lima Ambulance Service or to a charity of the donor's choice.

### James A "Jim" Galloway

Funeral services will be 2 p.m. Friday, Sept. 26, at the K&L Mortuary in Twin bridges, with Howard Mills, officiating, for James A. "Jim" Galloway, 72, of Silver Star. Burial will be in the Sheridan Cemetery.

Mr. Galloway died Sunday, Sept. 21, 1997, following a long battle with kidney disease.

He was born March 23, 1925, in Transylvania County, North Carolina, the son of Arden S. and Delia C. (Stapp) Galloway. They preceded him in death.

He attended schools in North Carolina and served in both World War II and Korean Conflict. He married Emily Taylor on Feb. 16, 1945, at Greenville, S.C. When he returned from WWII, he worked for the U. S. government, and returned to following his service in the Korean Conflict. He then went into private business as a building contractor, retiring in 1971, and moving to Grant. Two years later he moved to Silver Star.

He was a member of the Jehovah's Witnesses Church.

Survivors include his wife, Emily, of Silver Star; daughters and sons-in-law, Linda and Bill Dills of LaFollette, Tenn.; Marie and Hank Tumidajski of Fairfield, Conn.; and son and daughter-in-law, James A. Jr. and Linda Galloway of Butte; two brothers, Wade Galloway of Clinton, Tenn., and Alfred Galloway of Vancouver, Wash., and three granddaughters. He was preceded in death by three brothers, a sister and two grandsons.

Mr. Jones died Sept. 22 at St. Pat's Hospital in Missoula. He was born July 12, the son of Philip and Rachel Jones, and raised on the Jones ranch in the Centennial Valley.

He married Barbara Hill and was later divorced. He married Alice Darlene White on Feb. 10, 1947.

He worked for the Union Pacific Railroad for 22 years as a section man.

Survivors include Daryl Guy of Edmonton, Alberta; Norma Ruth Rhodehouse of Idaho Falls, Idaho, and Michael Gene Jones of Heyburn, Idaho.

### James A. Schneider

A memorial Mass for James A. Schneider, 85, will be Friday, Sept. 26, at Holy Rosary Church of Woodland, California. Burial will be in Woodland.

Mr. Schneider died Sept. 21, 1997, from injuries suffered in a car accident in Woodland.

He was born Oct. 20, 1911, at Alder, the son of John and Catherine Schneider. He attended school in the Ruby Valley, working with his father in sheep and cattle ranching in the valley. He later engaged in mining in the area, as well as in Butte.

He married Beulah Blevins on Dec. 15, 1934, at Dillon. They had two children, Robert James and Mary Francis. They lived at Placerville, Calif., for a number of years. Jim and Beulah moved to Dillon in October 1970, when they purchased the State Bar and dining room, which they operated until 1979, when they moved to Woodland. She died in 1984 at Woodland. His son, Robert James, died May 24, 1992.

He is survived by his daughter and son-in-law, Mary Francis Gentry and Bill Gentry of Citrus Heights, Calif.; a daughter-in-law, Jalene Schneider of Elk Grove, Calif.; six grandchildren, seven great-grandchildren; sister Frieda Held Pock of Woodland; three sisters, Mary A. Myers, Pearl Brooksle and Bessie F. Tolson; three brothers, Peter J., Johnnie H. and Frank L. preceded him in death.

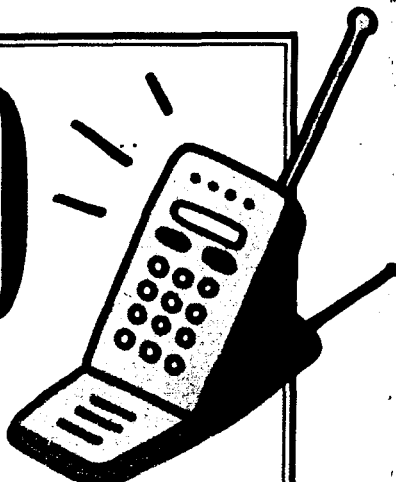
