E.M.C.O.E. SPONSORS LECTURE-CONCERT SERIES

This year EASTERN will have a very outstanding entertainment program which will include five lectures by nationally known speakers on the over-all topic, "Democratic Goals", three concerts and two dramatic productions.

Lectures are scheduled for Oct. 31, when Martin Hall will discuss democratic goals in Europe; Nov. 28, when Subodh Chandra Ray, a blind Hindu philosopher, will talk on the democratic trends in India. On January 30 Robert Bradford will dwell on the part tolerance plays in a democracy. On March 6 Charles Emerson Boddie will discuss the relationship between democracy and Christianity; and on March 28 Dr. Elwood C. Nance, president of Tampa University, will give the educational viewpoint on democracy.

The **Guardsman Quartet**, a male foursome specializing in Gay Ninety songs, will appear November 9. On April 12, Jerold Fredric, a renowned pianist, will present a concert. May 3 the Mozart Trio consisting of tenor, viola, and piano is scheduled to appear.

The lectures and concerts will be presented for the student body during the Assembly Hour and for the general public at a formal appearance at 8:00 p.m.
