RESERVE OFFICERS TRAINING CORPS MAY BE ADDITION ON E.M.C.E. CAMPUS

With an eye toward keeping more of Eastern's male students in school, attempts are being made to secure ROTC at Eastern.

The ROTC committee, combined with the War Service Credits committee, has been investigating the possibilities of organizing either an ROTC or an NORTC unit on the campus. The joint committee, made up of students and faculty, is composed of Dr. Harlan C. Hines, chairman; Mr. Arthur E. Soulsby, co-chairman; Mr. George H. Gleoge, Mr. Ralph W. Kent, Mr. Wm. S. Weichert and Miss Marjorie Stevenson representing the faculty and Tom Anderson, Bob Deming, Tim Mullowney, Dick Prill and Millard Simineo representing the students.

"The committee is further investigating the possible use of educational training for military service. We do, however, have hopes that some type of military training will be established," stated Mr. Soulsby.

Several meetings have been held with army and navy representatives, but nothing definite is known yet. Much depends on Congress, which is the final deciding factor.

Women's Honorary Picks New Name

White skirts and white sweaters worn by a group of sophomore women on Wednesdays and at school functions are the mark of Ayuda, according to President Jan Hartley.

The Spanish word meaning "she helps," was selected last week as the new name of the service group which has previously been known as Spurs.
