Students, and teachers of science, enrolled in the nationally televised "Atomic Age Physics" course will earn four credits this Fall quarter at Eastern College of Education, Robert J. McRae, coordinator at Eastern, announced today.

Registration in the course, titled Science 471, may be by mail addressed to McRae at Eastern. The fee is \$39.00 and may be presented by check or money order, and will cover this first course.

Registrations will be accepted until Oct. 27, McRae stated, and the first program will be beamed into the Billings area over KGHL-TV Monday, Oct. 13 at 2:30 p.m. The half-hour program will run five days a week.

Professor McRae stressed that Science 471 will be a pre-requisite to Science 472, which is the second quarter course, and which will carry 5 credit hours.
