Nineteen delegates from Eastern's chapter of Spurs will attend the regional convention to be held on the campus of Montana State college Nov. 7-9, Carole Baird revealed Tuesday. Other groups of Spurs from out of state planning to attend the convention include chapters from Idaho, Oregon and Washington. Over 14 colleges from these states will send delegates, Miss Baird stated.

The Spurs is a national organization founded Feb. 14, 1922 by the Mortar Board at Montana State college. Since then the Spurs have grown nationally to 34 college chapters in 12 states. In 1958 this service group of sophomore women on Eastern's campus was initiated into national Spurs at the national convention held in Los Angeles during June.
