Kampus Kutie

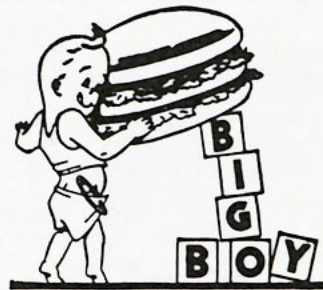


Billings' Bonnie Burton is this week's Kampus Kutie.
