

STUDENT UNION BUILDING BIDS OPEN TODAY

Bids for the building of Easterns new Student Union Building will be opened today in Helena. Meeting with the State Board of Examiners will be Dr. A.G. Peterson, Dr. R. N. Lowe, of the faculty, Mr. Raymond Nordquist, Mr. Leonard Sundell, the architects, Jim Roberts, Jerry Kemp, and George Knudson, of the Student Union Board.

The Cost of the building is estimated to be around \$120,000 with around \$1,000 left to furnish the new building. There is also \$600.00 for a new piano. Furniture in the present student lounge will also be used. The building should be ready for occupancy by the spring quarter of 1955. When completed the building will include a lounge, snackbar, barber shop, game room, and combination dining room and ballroom. The bookstore will also be located in the building. There will be a room for the student activities office and student publications office.

Plans call for the installation of an intercommunications system at a later date.

Construction of the building should begin in about two weeks.

FIRST CONVOCATION TO BE HELD TONIGHT

The first in the summer session convocation series will be held tonight, in the science auditorium. Mr. Earl Lucas, Eastern faculty member, will be in charge of tonight's convocation, and will feature three art films, Van Gogh, Pablo Picasso and Leonardo Da Vinci. Convocation time is 8 p. m. and there will be an informal reception following.

CAFETERIA UNDER NEW MANAGEMENT

The cafeteria is now being operated by Mr. and Mrs. Ed Anderson. Up until this time the cafeteria has been operated under the auspices of the Student Union Board. It was felt better service could be offered if the cafeteria was leased to a private individual. Mr. and Mrs. Anderson now have a six month lease on the equipment in the cafeteria. At the end of this period if the cafeteria is being operated to the satisfaction of both the Anderson's and the Student Union Board they will be offered a renewal on the lease. They will also be offered a franchise on the new SUB cafeteria.

ENROLLMENT HEAVIER THIS YEAR

LLOYD LA VAUX TO APPEAR JUNE 16

Lloyd La Vaux, "The Poet of the Accordion," will appear in concert here on June 16th at 8:00 p. m. in the college auditorium.

Mr. La Vaux has appeared on the professional stage since the age of six.

During World War II he served with the Allied Intelligence Service in Europe and received the Silver Star for "gallantry in action in Northern France."

Since 1945 Mr. La Vaux has been concentrating on solo concert music, transcriptions of the classics for the accordion and original pieces.
