### CEREMONY TO MARK GROUND-BREAKING AS CONSTRUCTION BEGINS ON NEW STUDENT UNION BUILDING

There will be a short ceremony Thursday morning at 10:30 a.m. to note the beginning of construction on the new SUB. Dr. Peterson will break the ground for the building on which construction will begin Friday. The building that has been long sought at Eastern and is now to be a reality, was cleared with the letting of bids last Friday.

The cost of the building, built entirely with student funds, is as follows:

General Construction, Frater Const. Co. \$94,523  
 Plumbing installation, Frisby Plr. & Htr. \$22,075  
 Electrical installation, Carol Dahlstrom \$ 7, 429

The architects fees, which are set by the state at a rate of 6.1% of the total are \$7,565.65.  
 The total cost of the building is 131,592.65.

It is interesting to note that in making his bid, Mr. Dahlstrom who is doing the electrical work, forgot to add the cost of his labor. This is the reason for the price being so low. However, the work will be done at the bid price.
