Proceedings of the Board of County
Commissioners of Teton County,
Montana. Regular September
Term, 1902.

Board met in regular session at
the office of the county clerk at 10 a. m.
Present: Chairman C. B. Perkins,
Commissioners M. Connelly and W. M.
Foster, and the clerk.

Minutes of regular June meeting
and of special meetings of June 23,
July 20, and August 11 were read and
approved.

Board proceeded to examine the re-
ports of county and township officers
for quarter ending August 31, 1902.
Following were approved and ordered
filed:

A. C. Warner, county clerk. Report
of warrants issued in payment of
salaries of county officers and au-
thorized deputies, amounting to \$2,456.21
on the contingent fund, and \$1,087.30
on the general fund. Also warrants
issued in compliance with orders of
the board made June 4 and 5, 1902,
on districts road funds, as follows:
Prince & Dean, repairs Marias bridge
district No. 3, \$700, John Zimmerman
road work on contract, district No. 1,
\$399.

A. C. Warner, county clerk. Re-
port of official fees collected amount-
ing to \$739.45, with treasurer's re-
ceipts for same.
Sterling McDonald, clerk district
court. Report of official fees collect-
ed and paid to treasurer, amounting
to \$138.50.

George C. Taylor, sheriff. Report
of jail boarders. Warrant ordered
for expense incurred.

Thos. O. Larson, assessor. Report
of tax collection, as follows: Personal
property taxes \$342.75, special poor
taxes \$800, special road taxes \$700,
total \$2,025.75 with treasurer's receipts
for same.

James Sulgrove, county attorney.
No collections.

Walter Mathews, surveyor. Re-
port of work performed.

Annie N. Austad, poorhouse con-
tractor. Report showing 3 inmates
cared for.

Adjourned to 2 p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION
Board reassembled at 2 p. m., all
members present, and continued ex-
amination of reports. Following
were approved and ordered filed:

J. E. DeHaas, justice of the peace
Choteau township. Warrant ordered
for cost incurred.

Chas. Parker, justice of the peace
Choteau township. Report showing
\$5 fines collected and paid to treasur-
er.

George W. Magee, justice of the
peace Dupuyer township. Report
of action tried. Warrants ordered
for cost incurred.

Wm. Dawes, justice of the peace
Marias township. Report of actions
tried. Warrant ordered for costs
incurred. Report also shows \$10 fines
collected and paid to treasurer.

Wm. Dawes, acting coroner. Re-
port of inquest held upon bodies of
P. Donovan, Alex Sedgwert and W.
Johnston. Warrants ordered for
costs incurred.

G. W. Walker, justice of the peace
Marias township. Report of actions
tried and showing \$80 fines collected
and paid to treasurer. Warrants
ordered for costs incurred.

G. W. Walker, acting coroner. Re-
port of inquest held on body of John
Whalen. Warrants ordered in pay-
ment of costs incurred.

Ordered that county attorney be
authorized to purchase volumes of
California reports necessary to com-
plete the set in his office.

Registry agents were appointed to
fill vacancies, as follows:

nild, vice Ed Bollerud, declined.
Cut Bank, No. 8, A. O. Cowley, vice
Don C. Leech, declined.
Shelby, No. 10, O. B. Smith, vice
Wm. Aylward declined.

Resignation of G. W. Walker as
justice of the peace, Marias township,
was presented and accepted.
Petitions were presented praying
for appointment of G. W. Turner
and Herman Anderson, respectively,
to office of justice of the peace Marias
township. After deliberation, board
appointed Geo. W. Turner to the
office.

Report of Fannie E. Chenoweth,
county superintendent schools, show-
ing official visits made, examinations
held and \$5 examination fees collected
was examined, approved and ordered
filed. Board then proceeded to de-
fine election precincts, as follows:
REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 1.

Precinct No. 1, Choteau. Town-
ship 23 north of ranges 4, 5 and 6 west;
sections 13 to 36 inclusive, of town-
ship 24 north, range 3 west; sections
13 to 36 inclusive, of township 24 north,
range 4 west; township 24 north of
ranges 5 and 6 west; sections 19 to 36
inclusive, of township 25 north of
range 5 west; sections 19 to 36 in-

clusive, of township 25 north of range
6 west.

Precinct No. 2, Lake Basin. Town-
ship 22 north of ranges 1 and 2 west;
township 23 north of ranges 1, 2 and
3 west; township 24 north of ranges
1 and 2 west.

REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 2.

Precinct No. 4, Bynum. Sections
1 to 18, inclusive, of township 25 north
of range 5 west; sections 1 to 18, in-
clusive, of township 25 north of range
6 west; all of townships 26 and 27
north of ranges 3, 4, 5 and 6 west.

REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 3.

Precincts No. 5 Dupuyer. Begin-
ning at township corner between
townships 27 and 28 north on range
line between ranges 4 and 5 west,
and running north on said range line
to the southeast corner of sec. 13,
township 30 north, range 5 west,
thence west along said section line to
the southwest corner of section 18,
township 30 north, range 5 west,
thence south to the southwest corner
of township 30 N. range 5 west, thence
west to Dupuyer creek; thence south-
westerly along Dupuyer creek to the
intersection of an east and west
center line of township 29 north,
range 6 west; thence west along said
line to center of township 29 north,
range 7 west; thence southwest to
the township corner between town-
ships 28 and 29 north, range 7 west;
thence in a westerly direction parallel
to and two (2) miles south of the
south line of the Blackfeet reserva-
tion to the western boundary line of
the county; thence north along said
boundary line to a point due west of
the center line of township 27 north;
thence east along said line extent led
to the southeast corner of section 13
in township 27 north, range 7 west;
thence north to township corner be-
tween townships 27 and 28 north,
ranges 6 and 7 west; thence east
along said township line to the place
of beginning.

Precincts No. 6, Birch Creek. Be-
ginning at a point where the west
line of section 6, township 30 north,
range 5 west, intersects Birch creek
and running south to the southwest
corner of township 30 north, range 5
west; thence west to Dupuyer creek;
thence southwesterly along Dupuyer
creek to the intersection of an east
and west center line of township 29
north, range 6 west; thence west
along said line to the center of t'p
29 north, range 7 west; thence south-
west to the township corner between
townships 28 and 29 north, range 7
west; thence in a westerly direction
parallel to and two (2) miles south of
the south line of the Blackfeet reserva-
tion to the western boundary line of
the county; thence north along said
boundary line to the said south line
of the Blackfeet reservation,
thence east and northeast along said
south line of the reservation to the
place of beginning.

REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 5.

Precinct No. 7, Bellevue. Town-
ships 23 and 24 north and the south
half of townships 25 north, all from
the east line of range 7 west to west-
ern boundary line of Teton county.

Precinct No. 8 North Fork. All
that portion of Teton county lying
south of the north line of township 22
north and west of the east line of
range 7 west.

REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 6.

Precinct No. 3, Farmington. Sec-
tions 1 to 12 inclusive, of township 24
north, range 3 west; sections 1 to 12
inclusive of township 24 north of
range 4 west; townships 25 north,
ranges 3 and 4 west.

REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 7.

Precinct No. 9, Lowry. All that
portion of Teton county embraced in
townships 20, 21 and 22 north, ranges
3, 4, 5 and 6 west.

REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 8.

Precinct No. 10, Cut Bank. Sec-
tions 1 to 12 inclusive, of township 32
north of range 4 west; sections 1 to 12
inclusive, of township 32 north, of
range 5 west; all of townships 33
north of ranges 4, 5 and 6 west; all
of township 34 north of ranges 4, 5
and 6 west; all of township 35 north
of ranges 4, 5 and 6 west; all of town-
ship 36 north of ranges 5 and 6 west.
Also the right of way of the Great
Northern Railway through the Black-
feet reservation.

REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 10.

Precinct No. 11 Pondera. Sections
1 to 18, inclusive, of township 27 north
of ranges 1 and 2 west; townships 28
and 29 north of ranges 1, 2, 3 and 4
west; sections 19 to 39 inclusive, of
township 30 north of ranges 1, 2, 3
and 4 west.

REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 10.

Precinct No. 12, Shelby. The north
half of township 30 north of ranges 1,
2, 3, 4 and 5 west; all of township 31
north, ranges 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 west;

all of township 32 north, ranges 1, 2
and 3 west; sections 13 to 36 in-
clusive, of township 32 north of range
4 west; sections 13 to 36 inclusive,
of township 32 north of range 5 west;
all of townships 33 and 34 north of
ranges 1, 2 and 3 west.

Precincts No. 13 Sweet Grass. All
of township 35 north of ranges 1, 2
and 3 west; all of township 36 north
of ranges 1, 2, 3 and 4 west; all of
township 37 north of ranges 1, 2, 3,
4, 5 and 6 west.

REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 12.

Precinct No. 14, Raymond. The
north half of township 25 north; all
of township 26 north, and the south
half of township 27 north, all from
the east line of range 7 west, west to
the western boundary of Teton county

REGISTRATION DISTRICT NO. 13.

Precinct No. 15, St Mary's (Swift
Current). All that portion of Teton
county embraced in the "ceded strip"
of the Blackfeet reservation.

Adjourned to 10 a. m. Sept. 3.

claims against county. Warrants
were ordered in payment of those
allowed.

Adjourned to 2 p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION.
Board reassembled at 2 p. m., all
members present and resumed busi-
ness of auditing claims against the
county. Warrants were ordered in
payment of those allowed.

Permission to leave the state for a
period not to exceed 30 days, was
granted Commissioner Connelly and
Clerk of Court McDonald.

Adjourned to 10 a. m. Sept. 4.

THIRD DAY.
Sept. 4, 1902. Board met at 10 a.
m., all members present.

Report of Geo C Taylor, sheriff, of
official fees, amounting to \$16, col-
lected and paid to treasurer, was
examined, approved and ordered filed.

Board resumed business of audit-
ing claims against county. Warr-
ants were ordered in payment of
those allowed.

Adjourned to 2 p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION.
Board reassembled at 2 p. m., all
members present.

A number of petitions for new roads
and changes in roads were presented
and viewers appointed for same.

Board then took up for hearing,
pursuant to continuance of July 24,
1902, report of viewers on proposed
change in Willow Rounds and Shelby
road as follows: Beginning at a point
on said road in section 11, township
31 north, range 4 west, thence in a
