The three republican candidates for county commissioners—Messrs. Braren, Bollerud and Cowgill—are in every way qualified to fill the positions to which they aspire.

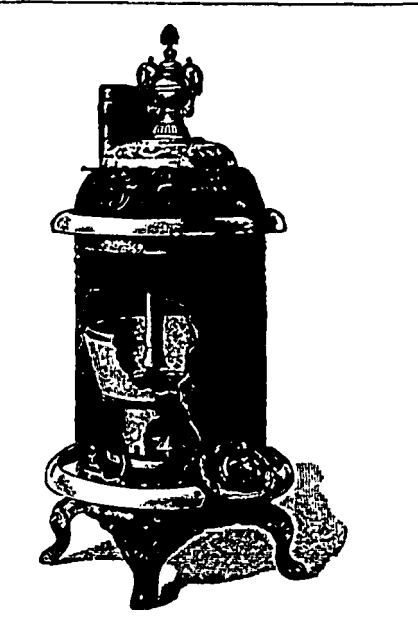
The democrats of Cascade county practically concede the election of Judge Holloway as associate justice of the supreme court.

Republican success in Teton county is assured if the republicans do their duty—vote their ticket straight.

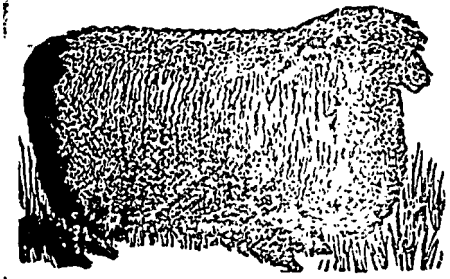
