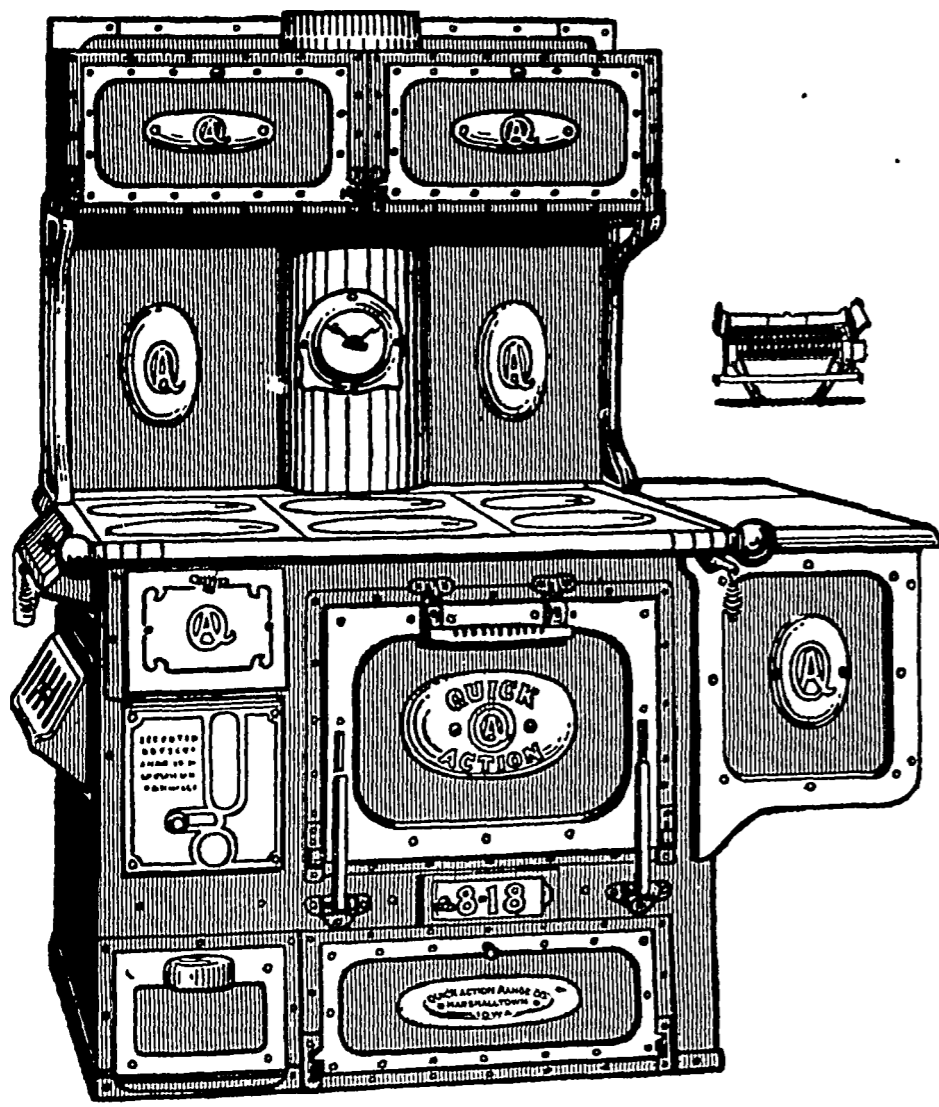


Which Costs The Most

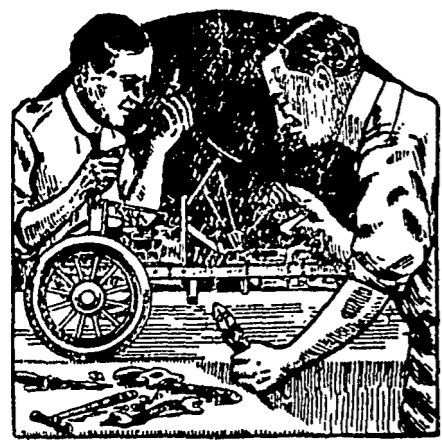
