Geiger's bill providing for the publication of assessor's lists was defeated last week in the senate. The principal objection urged against the bill was the cost of publication. The real objection doubtless was that it would prevent the frauds now practiced by the rich.

Were such a law as the Geiger bill in force rich stockmen could not withhold whole bands of sheep or half or two-thirds of their cattle as they sometimes do now. They would not dare to do such things. Too many would know about the short assessments and the rich would be brought to time as the poor always have been.

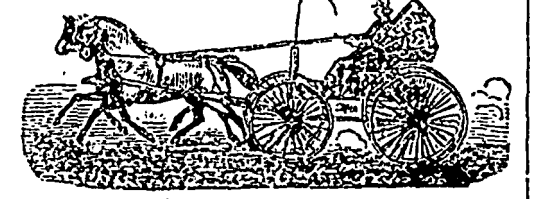
