Democratic State Platform.

The following is the platform adopted at Helena Sept. 15, 1904 by the democratic state convention: We the democrats of Montana, in convention assembled, adopt the following declaration of principles and pledge the nominees of the convention to be governed thereby: Believing in the principles of the democratic party, as taught by Thomas Jefferson, we indorse the platform of the national democratic party, as adopted by the St. Louis convention, and declare our allegiance to the nominations of Alton B. Parker for president and Henry G. Davis for vice president of the United States. We acknowledge with gratitude the public service rendered by our two United States senators, and especially in securing the passage of bills opening to settlement the Crow and Flathead Indian reservations. We endorse the system of national irrigation provided for by the Newland act. We believe that it should be carried out by competent engineers, in a non-partisan manner and without favor to special localities. We are glad to learn from the congressional records that among the earliest advocates of this system where Governor Toole and other democratic representatives in congress from the territory of Montana. We indorse the wise, conservative and judicious administration of Governor Joseph K. Toole. We especially commend the action of the state board of equalization, under his chairmanship, in increasing substantially the assessments of railroads in this state. We favor reducing the number of state and county officers and boards to the smallest possible number consistent with the proper transaction of public business, and to this end, pledge our legislative candidates to a careful investigation and revision of existing laws. We denounce the action of the republican governor of Colorado in attempting to legalize the crimes of military necessity. We denounce the unlawful deportation of citizens and the destruction of private property as the greatest crime ever perpetrated against our American form of government. We pledge all officers elected upon the democratic ticket to forever refrain from so turning the machinery of government into an instrument of oppression, but instead thereof, we pledge them to administer the laws so as to secure, as nearly as possible, equal and exact justice to the weak and powerful alike. Indorsing Governor Toole's recommendations to the Eighth legislative assembly, we demand First, an initiative referendum amendment, identical in all material provisions, with the amendment adopted by the voters of Oregon and sustained by the supreme court of that state, and we pledge all members of the legislative assembly, elected upon the democratic ticket, to vote and work therefor. Second, a state railroad commission, to be elected by popular vote. Third, a direct primary nomination law, conducted under the Australian ballot system, covering all state, county and municipal elective officers, and providing for the printing of names of all candidates upon one ballot, under proper party titles. Fourth, an efficient fellow-servant law, guaranteeing adequate protection to all classes of workmen engaged in hazardous occupations, and especially to all railroad, mining and smelter employees. Fifth, election of all important state officers by popular vote. Sixth, a constitutional amendment, empowering the state board of equalization to equalize property assessments in the state. The period of employment of

workingmen in all underground mines, and in mill and smelter for the treatment of ores, is now fixed by law at eight hours per day. It is proposed to embody this principle in a constitutional amendment, extending its scope so as to cover the works or undertakings carried on or aided by any municipal, county or state government, and on all contracts let by them; and to prevent the employment of children under 16 years of age in underground mines. We favor the adoption of this amendment at the ensuing election. We favor the election of United States senators by direct vote of the people. We instruct our candidate for congress, if elected, and our United States senators to vote for a strict Chinese exclusion act. A vote for M. S. Darling, is a vote not wasted. Every vote for the democratic candidates means that you are not voting for hot air promises. "All conceit" would be a better motto for "Always correct". While you are looking up your choice, don't forget J. L. Collins for assessor. The treasurer should not be overlooked when you make calculations: Tom Brooks is the man you want. More commonly know as Doctor Brooks. The only way Montana will get a railroad commission is by the people supporting the democratic platform. The g o p had a chance to give us a commission and voted it down in the legislature, but now the people of this state have the opportunity of disapproving the actions of the legislature and should do it. You will find both party tickets published in the Montanian. Look them over and then see which you will support. If you want to still keep those political grafters in office who have been in now for eight or ten years, vote the republican ticket. If you would have your section of the county represented in an official way by men who are as capable of handling the county affairs, and men who will at least let the county attorney instruct the county commissioners, you will make no mistake when you place a cross in front of the names on the democratic ticket.
