**Beavers Beat Salmon, Bow to Cathedral**

**Bulldogs Crack 10-Game Losing Streak with Twin Wins over Parsons**

Western Montana's Bulldogs and Dillon's Beavers provided fans with a triple dose of classy court work over the weekend as the Straughmen pasted Westminster's Parsons twice and the Nield Club flashed a second half comeback to edge the highly-rated Savages of Salmon, Idaho.

Western, avenging a pair of earlier defeats by the Utahans at Salt Lake City, had an easy time here Friday in an 86-59 rout but got a scare from the Parsons in the closing minutes Saturday before taking a 67-60 nod.

**Cleanly Played**

The Friday opener was one of the cleanest contests seen here in years with only 24 fouls called, 10 on the local club and 14 on the visitors.

Westminster, after playing point-for-point during the opening ten minutes, faded badly to trail 42-21 at halftime and never threatened thereafter.

The balanced Bulldog scoring saw Schmautz get 15, Sullivan and Johns 14 each, Silliker 13 and Silberman 10. Chris Segura, a 5-9 phantom guard, swished 16 for the Parsons.

Gary Bliss, the Parsons' 6-6 workhorse, was high for the game with 24.

**Ferris, Stone Sparkle**

Saturday's match against Salmon proved a complete turnabout for the Nield five as they surprised the Savages with a red-headed secret weapon named Stone to pull out a high-scoring, beautifully played 78-70 heartstopper at the college gym.

Salmon, beaten only once in eight outings prior to their journey here, displayed flawless basketball as they took a commanding 23-15 quarter lead and remained in front, 45-40, at halftime.

The Beavers took their first lead at 62-60 in the closing seconds of the third quarter and the final stanza was a crowd-pleaser all the way with Dillon holding a slim margin throughout.

Ed Ferris, driving the baseline with unbelievable perfection, and big Jerry Stone, elevated to the varsity squad only last week, pro-

vided the final quarter fireworks. With Dillon out front by three and two and a half minutes remaining, Stone poured home nine straight markers to ice the contest.

Ferris finished with 26, Stone 17—16 in the last half—and Jim Womack also netted 17.

Don Wolf, a 5-9 guard, swished 20 for the Savages who were handicapped by the loss of their two scoring stars on fouls throughout the final stages of the game.

Dillon returns to conference play here Friday when they host the Powell County Wardens of Deer Lodge.
