## TO INSTITUTE REV. ANDREWS THIS EVENING

The Rt. Rev. Chandler W. Sterling, Bishop Coadjutor of Montana, will formally institute the Rev. E. W. Andrews as rector St. James' Episcopal church in services at the church this evening at 8 p. m.

Evensong will open the service, with the Rev. James Holt of Butte as officiant, the Rev. Thomas Sargent of Anaconda as psalmist, and the Rev. John Hay of Virginia City as lectioner. Bishop Sterling will deliver the sermon.

High point of the symbolism in a service of institution is the delivery of the keys of the church to the new rector. This will be done by the senior warden of St. James' Church, Cornelius Hovren. A reception will follow the service, at which guests will be given an opportunity to meet the Bishop and other clergy. Refreshments will be served.

Two "firsts" will be marked in this service. It will be Bishop Sterling's first service of institution since his consecration as Bishop on Oct. 30. It will also be the Bishop's first service in St. James' Church.

Bishop Sterling was elected as Bishop Coadjutor to assist the Rt. Rev. Henry H. Daniels, Bishop of Montana, and to succeed him after his retirement next February. The new Bishop is a native of Illinois and served churches in Wisconsin, Illinois and Nebraska before his election.

The Youth choir of the First Presbyterian church will sing at Morning worship every Sunday during the Advent season. Just the 11 o'clock service of worship will be held during Advent.

### MONTANA POWER TAXES AMOUNT TO \$11,500,000

Two checks totaling \$17,471 have been delivered by the Montana Power Company to Beaverhead county treasurer Martha Greene in payment of the firm's first-half property tax bill for 1956.

J. E. Corette, president and general manager of the company, said the utility's 1956 property tax bill in Montana is \$3,326,137, which would be sufficient to educate 10,079 Montana elementary and secondary school children for one year at \$330 per pupil.

He pointed out, however, that the property tax payments are used for many purposes, including government operation and highways, besides education.

The 1956 property tax bill is \$201,316 more than the \$3,124,821 paid in 1955.

Altogether, Montana Power's 1956 tax bill, counting federal assessments, will be about \$11,500,000.

R. E. Crangle, head of the tax department, said the utility is protesting \$439,681 of its 1956 property tax bill in the state. He said most of the protested amount results from the assessment made by the State Board of Equalization of intercounty electric and natural gas lines which the company claims to be excessive and discriminatory.

Pitman scored 16 points for Western before leaving the game, but Ray Scott led the Bulldog scoring with 18 points.

Bob McLeod, playing again after his knee operation, gathered 10 points, and Bob Niell, the Ricks transfer, scored 9 points against his former mates.

In a preliminary game the Western Freshmen defeated the Ricks junior varsity, 68-61.

The two teams meet again at Ricks tonight, following which the Bulldogs return to Dillon to meet the Carroll Saints in the Western gym Saturday night.

The Beavers will play two games in the high school gym this weekend, according to coach Pat Curran. One will be against St. Ignatius Friday night at 9 o'clock, while the other will be with Sugar City, Ida., Saturday night at 7.

He also stated that the games should be good, as St. Ignatius was state "B" class champion last year and Sugar City is one of the strongest teams in eastern Idaho.

The Beavers will be led this year by Ed Zink, who was unanimously chosen by the basketball players for the job. Besides Ed, the starting line-up for the two games will consist of Jack Gibbons, Tom Mitchell, Russell Munday and Bob Wallace. He also said the Beavers are starting their season with a good attitude and high morale. All of the players have shown a great deal of desire to play basketball. Due to the fact that a new system is being instituted this year, early games may indicate a need of seasoning and playing experience before the new patterns become familiar to the players.

### Real Estate Taxes Are Due Friday

Taxpayers who wish to avoid automatic penalties which will increase their first half tax bills for 1956 must make payment in the county treasurer's office before 5 p. m. Friday or must mail checks or money orders to the county treasurer before Saturday morning.

Martha Greene, the treasurer, again reminded the public that the law provides an automatic two per cent of the amount of delinquent tax bill as an immediate penalty, plus additional penalty of two-thirds of one per cent per month or fraction thereof, until the bill is paid.
