Battle Field Is Being Improved

The Monument of the Big Hole Battle Field is now included in a National 10 year program, from 1956 to 1966, for the improvement of U. S. National Parks and Monuments called "Mission 66". This year a part of its budget has been allowed to the Big Hole Battle Monument and a supervisor will be assigned for 12 months to work out the project and gather the history of the Battle. Recent visitors at the Monument were Assistant Superintendent Warren F. Hamilton of Yellowstone Park, Merrick Smith, Landscape Architect, WODC and Merle Mattes, Regional Historian of Omaha. Their visit was to look over the grounds and recommend the improvement program. Improvement of the Battle Field began August 12 when Ernest Denry and Bob DeLoure of Wisdom began work on the parking lot, bridges, guard rails and trails which will be finished before snow flies.

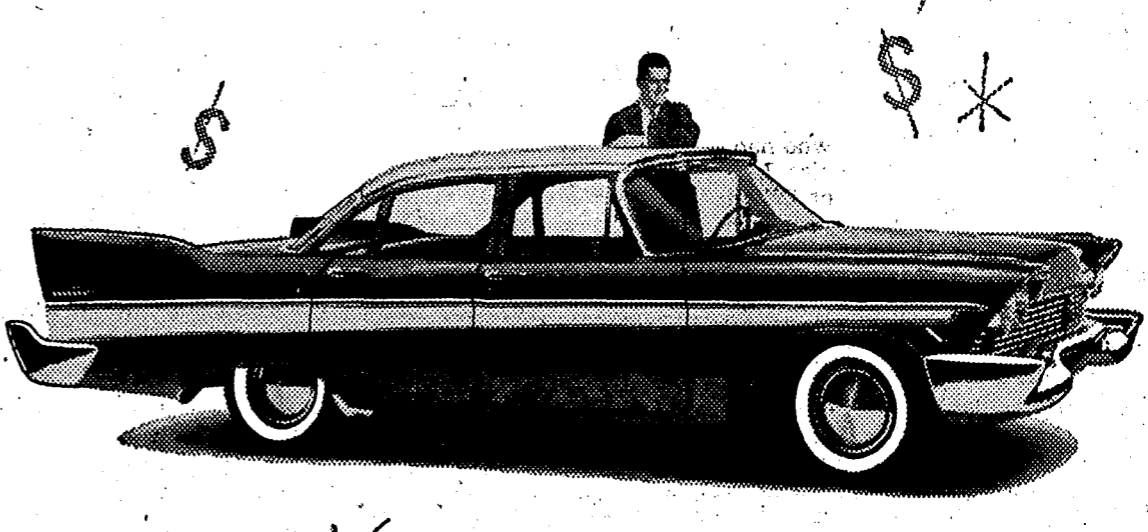
